Pattern: Subjunctive Suggest and Recommend Conversation Questions

Use the following pattern with the verbs **suggest** and **recommend** to respond to the questions, and then continue your conversation naturally:

I + suggest/recommend + (that) + you/he/she/it/we/they + [bare infinitive] e.g. I suggest he read the newspaper.

- 11. I work late and I find it hard to get to sleep. Got any ideas?
- 12. My friend asked me for a bingeable TV show. What can I tell her?
- 13. How about we bake something with the new oven? What should we bake?
- 14. A couple that I know is going to the United States. Can you suggest any cities or sights they should visit?
- 15. Gilberto wants to live a very long time. How can he do that?
- 16. What's a good way that I can save money?
